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# Texas Population

## Second most populous state in US

- Texas Population estimated at: 27,862,596 on July 1, 2016
- Population growth for the State of Texas to be approximately **10.8%** from 4/1/2010 to 7/1/2016
- Persons under 18 years of age make up over a quarter of the Texas population at 26.2% (7.3 mil)



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# Medicaid Statistics

## Reporting from all US States

- Annual EPSDT Participation Report/CMS-416
- Total individuals eligible for EPSDT through the age of 20 years
- Total individuals eligible for EPSDT for 90 Continuous days
- EPSDT = Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment



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# Medicaid Statistics

## Fiscal Year 2016

- **National:** Total individuals eligible for EPSDT: 42,245,356
- **National:** Total individuals eligible for EPSDT for 90 Continuous Days: 39,742,040
- **Texas:** Total individuals eligible for EPSDT: 3,932,612
- **Texas:** Total individuals eligible for EPSDT for 90 Continuous Days: 3,650,385 (9.2% of US)

# Percentage of total eligible receiving some dental or oral health service

# Percentages of children receiving services (15-18 years old)

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## Texas Medicaid

- Percentage of children receiving any dental service who had preventive services went from 83.2% in 2012 to 95.6% in 2016
- Percentage of children receiving any dental service who had dental treatment went from 73.3% in 2012 to 57.5% in 2016
- Percentage of children receiving any dental service maintained around 63%



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# Summary

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## Texas Medicaid

- Program has increased along with overall Texas population
- Children who have oral health services in the medical home have a high probability of seeing a dentist that year
- For children of older ages – preventive services have increased and treatment services have decreased
- Managed care has potentially had an impact on dental treatment/dental care
