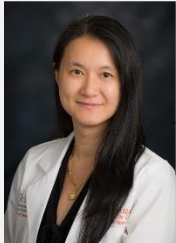

Course Description:

A Panel of national and international experts discussing the impact of COVID-19 on our world and communities with emphasis on Leadership and the future of dentistry in 21st century. This presentation will reflect on high-level leadership principles that are vital to emerge as a leader in the profession during these challenging times. Key principles that will be canvassed are cultivating humility, building resilience and enabling change—each will be discussed in the context of the future of dentistry. An expert will also cover leadership in adapting dental technologies to improve procedural workflows to help reduce clinical chairside time and patients’ visits to dental offices during this pandemic. In addition, Project ECHO telementoring program with complimentary specialist case consultation will also be discussed – both in the context of the future of dentistry. Lastly, an expert will share a creative model of dental mission protocol to address refugees’ dental needs at this time of global pandemic when international help and missions were significantly reduced due to travel restriction.

Educational Objectives:

- Participants will be able to reflect on leadership principles that contribute to the personal growth.
- Participants will learn how to use digital dental technologies to improve quality and reduce patient’s visits to dental office in addition to telementoring program for specialist consultation.
- Participants will learn the new protocol to provide oral care to refugees and underserved population safely in the era of pandemic.
