Struggling to Survive, the First Rural Hospitals Line Up for New Federal Lifeline

Hospitals in New Mexico, Texas, and Oklahoma are among the first to apply for a new rural hospital payment model that shifts the focus of services away from overnight stays to outpatient and emergency care. Still, experts say the law needs to be amended to provide the right mix of care for rural communities.

Research reveals that people with mental diseases are 2.7 times more prone to poor oral health, and lose their teeth early. Mental and oral health share a two-way link; anxiety and panic are often associated with dental treatment."

Because the demand for community-based services and supports often outweighs available resources, applicant's names may be placed on an interest list until services are available. However, some needs may be met through other programs until an applicant's name comes to the top of the list. People can receive Medicaid or other community services while they are on the interest list, if they are eligible. Receiving other services does not impact a person's place on an interest list. Members discussed what implementation might look like in public schools and what materials would be needed. Lesley Briggs with Midwest Dental Equipment and Supply shared information on prepasted toothbrushes as a viable option to use in schools, or for older adults in nursing homes or senior living centers.

New OHRC Publication

The National Maternal and Child Oral Health Resource Center (OHRC) recently released Open Wide: Oral Health Training for Health Professionals and Early Childhood Professionals—Second Edition, a series of four modules designed to help professionals working in programs (e.g., Head Start, home visiting, WIC) promote oral health in the course of promoting overall health for children from birth to age 6.

"The curriculum presents information about tooth decay, risk factors, and prevention; explains how to perform an oral health risk assessment and screening; and highlights anticipatory guidance to share with parents. After completing the modules, register to take the post-tests to receive a certificate of completion."
