

Advocacy Sign-On Letter for Veterans Oral Health

2023 Texas Legislative Session

The 2023 session ends Monday, May 29, 2023, and bills are moving quickly through the chambers. TxOHC is monitoring a number of bills across our priority issues, to keep up to date on those bills, please visit https://txohc.org/advocacy/texas-legislative-update/.

Some highlights include:

<u>HB3039</u> passed the House Public Health Committee on April 26, 2023 with substitution, and has been placed on the General State Calendar for Saturday, May 6, 2023. This bill would enact and enter Texas into the Dentist and Dental Hygienist Compact.

HB12 passed the Texas House on April 21, 2023 with a 132-8 vote. The bill currently awaits action in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee as of May 2, 2023, but Governor Abbott highlighted his support for the policy in his budget recommendations so it looks promising. If you are interested in supporting this bill, contact your senator. Texans Care for Children has an Action Center you can use to send a message or you can contact your senator directly on the Texas Senate website.

The appropriations bill, <u>HB1</u>, passed both the House and Senate, but the House refused to concur on April 20th so both the House and Senate have appointed conferees. HB 1 authorizes the state's expenditures for the 2024-25 fiscal biennium and is the only legislation each session that lawmakers must pass.

The status of Rep. Klick's amendment (adopted by the House 4.6.23) on the STAR+PLUS Pilot Program (SP3) in the current version of the bill is unknown. Strategy A.3.6 does not appear in the Senate Amendments Printing, the most recent version of the bill made public.

HB 446 has passed both the House and Senate as of May 3, 2023. This bill relates to the terminology used in statute to refer to intellectual disability and certain references to abolished health and human services agencies.

<u>HB3824</u> relating to the administration of a local anesthetic agent by a dental hygienist has been scheduled for a public hearing House Public Health Committee on Monday, May 8, 2023.

This bill requires 70 hours of education for infiltration which the Texas Dental Hygienists' Association (TDHA) does not support.

The public hearing begins at 8:00 AM and HB 3824 is listed as the first bill. If you are interested in this hearing you may view or get involved in the following ways:

2021 Youth Risk Behavior Survey Results Now Available

Recently CDC released the 2021 Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) data that provides the most recent information on ongoing and emerging health behaviors and

The 2021 YRBS data show dietary and physical activity behaviors among high school students did not improve during the pandemic.

The WHO Launches the Health Inequality Data Repository

The World Health Organization (WHO) launched the Health Inequality Data Repository (HIDR), the "most comprehensive global collection of publicly available disaggregated data and evidence on population health and its determinants." The repository is a valuable tool for assessing systemic health inequalities and gaining a better understanding of the "rich-poor gap" in health care coverage among vulnerable populations. The HIDR will improve data collection and increase capacity for analyses of health inequities, like oral health, that are essential to promoting health equity across the globe.

Special Report of the National Council on Disability

The National Council on Disability (NCD) is pleased to announce the release of a new Special Report entitled, "Incentivizing Oral Health Care Providers to Treat Patients with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities." This report provides Key Recommendations to the President, Congress, and the Department of Health and Human Services on policy changes in Medicaid and Medicare aimed at improving access, care, and oral health equity for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD).


"People with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) experience significant issues accessing quality, appropriate, and timely oral health care (OHC) services. Despite efforts by federal, state, and local agencies, legislatures, and key advocates, adults with I/DD remain the largest minority population with unmet OHC needs. There are several systemic and environmental reasons for this; however, three major factors exist. These include (1) the insufficient number of OHC providers rendering care to people with I/DD, (2) the lack of government policies that support dental benefits for people with I/DD, and (3) the insufficient funding to support essential OHC services for people with I/DD."

County Health Rankings Published

County Health Rankings & Roadmaps brings actionable data, evidence, guidance and stories to support community-led efforts to grow community power and improve health equity. This year, the focus is on the connection between civic health and thriving people and places. Civic health reflects the opportunities people have to participate in their communities.

To find county data, you can <u>search by your location</u> and search across 34 measures that help communities understand how healthy they are. One measure included is the ratio of population to dentists, per 2021 data there is one dentist per 1,610 people registered in Texas.



Notes: The data in this table reflect the average population served by a single dentist.

The Healthy Smiles Project

TxOHC is pleased to host two upcoming webinars on the Healthy Smiles Project. The first webinar with Stacey Griner, PhD, MPH, CPH, RDH on June 9, 2023, will provide an overview of the Healthy Smiles and Project, and more information on the training webinar with Jane Cotter, RDH, MS, CTTS scheduled for July 14, 2023 will be forthcoming.

The <u>Healthy Smiles project</u> is an initiative funded by MD Anderson Cancer Center and has two parts – 1) providing dental hygienists with CE courses about the HPV vaccine and 2) participating in oral health events for children ages 9-17 in a free health clinic where they will be able to receive a free dental cleaning and the HPV vaccine.










ADA Wordle spinoff game 'Dentle'
