FIND COVERAGE FOR YOUR FAMILY

Medicaid and CHIP offer free or low-cost health insurance for kids and teens. Children can get regular check-ups, immunizations, doctor and dentist visits, hospital care, mental health services, prescriptions and more. Children in a family of four earning up to \$49,200 a year or more may qualify. Families and individuals can apply online, by phone, by mail or in person.

Have you had trouble finding a dentist for your child? Use this Dentist Locator to find a dentist in your community who sees children and accepts Medicaid and CHIP.

Finding a dentist is easy:

- 1. Select your state from the drop-down menu.
- 2. Select your child's dental plan from the drop-down menu.
- 3. Enter a street address or zip code close to where you live or work.
- 4. Choose a distance from that street address or zip code that you wish to search within.

If you want to look for a specialty dentist, such as an oral surgeon or dentists who speak your language, expand the Additional Search Criteria and select options that fit your needs.

INSURANCE AND DENTAL PROVIDER INFORMATION

COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS/FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTERS

There are community health clinics throughout the state that are federally and state funded. These clinics are not under the state Oral Health Program's management. These clinics provide medical services and most provide dental services for adults, although some clinics may restrict services to children only.

The clinics charge discounted co-payment rates for dental services. Their eligibility requirements are based

on household income and use a sliding fee scale. You do not have to live in the county where the clinic is located. There may be a waiting list for services. If you are in pain with a toothache or have infection, please mention this when you call the clinic.

your zip code, and a list of clinics with distance, address, phone number, and links to driving directions and maps. TITLE V MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

Title V Maternal and Child Health Fee-for-Service Contractors provide direct services to low income (Texas resident) women and children not eligible for Medicaid/CHIP, CHCIP Perinatal or another payor source and have a gross family income at or below 185% FPL. **Dental services are provided for pregnant women up to 3 months postpartum.** These services include comprehensive and periodic oral evaluations, radiographs, and preventive and therapeutic dental services.

TEXAS MEDICAID PROGRAMS

Children age 20 or younger whose families are considered low or very-low-income are eligible for Medicaid and have comprehensive dental benefits through MCNA and DentaQuest. **Dental benefits are not included for adults (on any Texas Medicaid program**), but can be added as a value-added service (services offered in addition to the existing benefits).

TEXAS HAS FIVE MEDICAID PROGRAMS:

STAR

Medicaid for children, newborns, pregnant women and some families with children.

STAR Kids

Medicaid for children and adults under 20 with disabilities.

STAR Health

Medicaid for children who get their coverage through the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services.

STAR+PLUS

Medicaid program for adults (21+) who have disabilities or are 65 and older (aged, blind, disabled)

CHIP

CHIP covers children in families that earn too much money to qualify for Medicaid but cannot afford to buy private insurance.
