

We have come a long way in the last 20 years, but our work is not over and we are asking for your support to continue our efforts. Texas currently has over 5.8 million enrolled in Medicaid with over 900,000 that recently lost Medicaid benefits due to the Medicaid unwinding and redeterminations since April 2023. According to Texas 2036,



Texas has the unfortunate distinction of having the nation's highest uninsured rate — about 18% in 2021, compared to the national average of 8.6% — and its largest uninsured population of roughly 5 million people. This presents new challenges to face on how best to provide care for this growing underserved population.

HHS Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters for 2025 Proposed Rule

In the HHS Notice of Benefit and Payment Parameters (Payment Notice) for 2025 proposed rule released November 15, 2023, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) proposed standards for issuers and Marketplaces, as well as requirements for agents, brokers, web-brokers, direct enrollment entities, and assisters that help Marketplace consumers. This proposed rule also includes several proposals impacting the Medicaid program, Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), and the Basic Health Program (BHP).

Presented by: Ashley LeMaistre, MPH with the UT Austin Tobacco Research and Evaluation Team

Patients are 66% more likely to successfully quit tobacco when healthcare providers actively intervene to connect them with FREE services. The UT Tobacco Research & Evaluation Team provides support to healthcare systems for the implementation of tobacco cessation support strategies, by referring patients who use tobacco and wish to quit, to the Texas Quitline. Referrals can be made by fax, app or through the electronic medical record using the eTobacco Protocol (electronic tobacco cessation referral protocol). When a patient is referred to the Quitline by a healthcare professional, the patient can receive up to 5 counseling sessions and approximately 2 weeks of nicotine replacement therapy if they are 18 or older. Services are confidential, HIPAA-compliant and free. Our team can provide assistance to healthcare systems, including clinics and health departments with an EMR/EHR, to help them explore and leverage any referral method that is appropriate for them, and especially for the eTobacco Protocol.

New CMS Resources to Address Social Determinants

The White House and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), is releasing several resources to help support federal agencies, states, local and tribal governments to better coordinate health care, public health, and social services. Specifically, the White House is releasing the first ever <u>U.S. Playbook to Address Social</u>

<u>Determinants of Health</u>. To accompany this, the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) is releasing a <u>Call to Action to Address Health Related Social Needs, and a Medicaid and CHIP Health-Related Social Needs Framework</u>. This builds on the Administration's work to advance health equity by acknowledging that peoples' social and economic conditions play an important role in their health and wellbeing.

Dallas Community Water Fluoridation Update

We have been keeping you all apprised of the recent events of the Dallas City Council regarding community water fluoridation. To learn the outcome from these recent committee briefings, please read the article linked below from Kera News on November 7, 2023.

On October 16, 2023 Dr. Mary Swift with the Texas Dental Association, Dr. Johnny Johnson of the American Flouridation Society, and Dr. Philip Huang and Dr. Anh Nguyen with Dallas County Health and Human Services presented a briefing on community water fluoridation to the City of Dallas Quality of Life, Arts and Culture Committee (CDQLAC). At the end of the presentation a second briefing was requested by the committee chair to hear from the other side of the topic.

Anti-fluoridationists had their CDQLAC committee briefing on Tuesday, November 7, 2023 with Fluoride Committee Co-Chair Dr. Griffin Cole from the International Academy of Oral Medicine and Toxicology, researcher Dr. Bruce Lanphear with Simon Fraser University, and Dr. John Staniland from the Fluoride Action Network presenting.
